Founded in 1990, Mother Tongue began as an International literary periodical, publishing translations from authors' mother tongues. In 1994 Mother Tongue became a private literary press, publishing signed limited-edition chapbooks of Canadian poetry. In 2008 Mother Tongue became a regional trade press, publishing four books a year.
